



NextWindow Touch Screens to Power New Computer Monitor from the World's Fourth Largest PC Vendor

Lenovo L2461 with 23" Multi-touch Screen from NextWindow to Begin Shipping Next Month

Pleasanton, CA – January 21, 2010 – NextWindow, a provider of optical touch screens for desktop PCs, monitors and large-format displays, today announced that a new desktop computer monitor will feature NextWindow optical touch screens. Lenovo, the world's fourth largest PC vendor and the number one PC vendor in China, is launching the L2461 desktop monitor featuring a 23" interactive touch screen designed and manufactured by NextWindow. The Lenovo L2461, which will begin shipping next month, was on display at the 2010 Consumer Electronics Show (CES) in Las Vegas.

Lenovo is the latest PC maker to deliver a product for the Touch PC market. Dell, Medion, NEC and Sony all offer a touch-enabled PC, monitor, or both, and each vendor is using NextWindow touch screens. NextWindow has become a consistent provider of touch screens due to a focus on innovation. Last month NextWindow announced the addition of two new touch screen patents to its IP portfolio, which dates back to 2000. And in July 2009 NextWindow became the first optical touch screen manufacturer to announce Windows 7 logo certification. With the addition of the L2461 to its project roster, NextWindow has more project wins than any other desktop-focused touch screen manufacturer.

"There are many new touch PCs on the market," said Al Monro, CEO at NextWindow. "And while the cell phone and tablet markets are helping to drive awareness, we're hearing that adoption of touch-enabled desktop PCs has really taken off since Windows 7 launched in October."
